March 30, 2023

A meeting of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District's Recreation Committee was held at the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, Carrington, North Dakota, on March 30, 2023. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Klein at 10 a.m.

MEMBERS PRESENT

OTHERS PRESENT

Garrison Diversion staff and others were in attendance. A copy of the registration sheet is attached to these minutes as Annex I.

The meeting was recorded to assist with compilation of the minutes.

READING OF THE MINUTES

Motion by Director Cayko to dispense with a reading of the September 28, 2022, Recreation Committee minutes and approve them as distributed. Second by Director Metzger. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

CURRENT FUNDING AND PROJECT REVIEW

Merri Mooridian, Secretary, referred to the table listing current outstanding projects, stating the amount expended toward recreation projects in 2023 is \$215,341. The balance remaining to be expended is \$1,557,159. A copy of the table showing current projects is attached to these minutes as Annex II.

EXPIRING PROJECTS

Cass County Commission - - Ms. Mooridian commented in May 2020, the Cass County Commission received \$4,721 in grant funds for Phase I renovations at the Red River Valley Fair Campground. Our records indicate no funding has been expended for the project. The county auditor was contacted concerning the outstanding balance and no reply was received; therefore, these funds will go back into the recreation grant account.

LaMoure Park Board - - Ms. Mooridian stated the LaMoure Park Board was awarded \$45,000 in May 2020 to add camper pedestals, outlets and water at Sunset Park. There is a balance remaining from that project of \$17,974. The sponsor has indicated there is still work to complete on the project and would like an extension.

Motion by Director Walter to extend the project deadline on the Sunset Park Phase II project until October 31, 2023. Second by Director Johnson. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Forde, Johnson, Klein, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

City of Underwood - - Ms. Mooridian reported the City of Underwood was also awarded funding in May 2020 in the amount of \$15,668 for development of a walking path throughout the city. Our records indicate none of these funds have been expended. The sponsor was contacted, but a reply has not been received; therefore, these funds will go back into the recreation grant account.

Sargent County Park Board - - Ms. Mooridian reported the Sargent County Park Board received \$6,377 in grant funds in May 2020 for construction of a unisex bathroom/bathhouse facility at the Silver Lake Recreational Area. The project sponsor has been contacted, and they indicated the project is not yet finished. They have experienced delays due to COVID; therefore, an extension has been requested on the project deadline.

Motion by Director Metzger to extend the project deadline on the Silver Lake Recreational Area project until September 1, 2023. Second by Director Forde. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Forde, Johnson, Klein, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Riverwalk Park & Trail System - - Ms. Mooridian stated the City of Hillsboro received \$89,973 in May of 2020 to develop the Riverwalk Park and Trail System. Our records indicated no funds had been disbursed for this project; however, a request for reimbursement was received today and is being processed. The project has been completed, but not to the extent that was applied for. There are unused funds of approximately \$48,000 that will be deposited back to the recreation program.

North Dakota State Fair - - Ms. Mooridian reported the North Dakota State Fair was awarded \$26,450 in May 2020 for development of the West Park at the state fairgrounds. Our records indicate there is an outstanding balance of \$4,588.40 on this project. The sponsor was contacted, and they would like to extend the contract deadline and amend the project to use the remaining funds to install lighting along the walking path that was created as part of the project development but not listed in the initial grant application.

Motion by Director Walter to extend the project deadline for the North Dakota State Fair to December 1, 2023, and amend the contract by allocating the remaining funds of \$4,588.40 to install lighting along the walking path in West Park located on the fairgrounds. Second by Director Cayko. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Forde, Johnson, Klein, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Ward County Parks - - Ms. Mooridian reported Ward County Parks received \$26,950 to construct a pavilion at Rice Lake. Our records indicate none of these funds have been expended. The sponsor was contacted, and they indicated the project has been delayed due to lack of available contractors and scarcity of building supplies. They plan to re-bid the contract this spring and, hopefully, complete the project this summer or next summer. An extension on the project is requested until December 2024.

Ms. Mooridian suggested extending the deadline for one year rather than two years. If, after that time, the project is still not completed another extension could be considered.

Motion by Director Walter to extend the project deadline on the Rice Lake pavilion project until December 1, 2023. Second by Director Metzger. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Forde, Johnson, Klein, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Williams County Water Resource District - - Ms. Mooridian reported the Williams County Water Resource District received funding of \$3,675 in May 2020 to purchase new picnic tables for the confluence of the Yellowstone and Missouri Rivers. Our records indicate none of these funds have been expended. The sponsor was contacted, and no reply has been received; therefore, these funds will go back into the recreation grant account.

COMPLETED PROJECTS

Ms. Mooridian referred to the completed projects table. As of December 31, 2022, funding in the amount of \$7.3 million has been awarded for recreation projects since the program's inception in 1990. Total expenditures from inception through 2022 are \$6.7 million.

ENGELS POINT/STUMP LAKE

Duane DeKrey, General Manager, Garrison Diversion, informed the committee the 404 Permit needed to raise the road on the Stump Lake land owned by Garrison Diversion has finally been approved. This will now allow Garrison Diversion's O&M crew to perform the work on the road in the spring, and the recreation project at Stump Lake can move forward.

A dedication ceremony for the Stump Lake Recreational Area has been set for September 6.

MATCHING RECREATION GRANT APPLICATION

Chairman Klein referred to the recreation grant program policy statement and grant application, which is in the meeting packet for the committee's referral.

REVIEW OF GRANT APPLICATIONS

McKenzie County and Park Board - - Peggy Hellandsaas, representing McKenzie County and the Tobacco Gardens Recreation Area, addressed the committee regarding their funding request of \$41,250 for construction of a shower/bathroom facility at Tobacco Gardens Recreation Area on Lake Sakakawea. The total estimated project cost is \$160,285, which allows for 25% funding of the nonfederal share in the amount of \$40,071. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex III.

McLean County Fair Board - - Diane Schell, representing the McLean County Fair Board, addressed the committee regarding the fair board's funding request of \$6,950 to construct a structure to house the announcer stand for the horse arena and concession area. The total estimated project cost is \$27,783, which allows for 25% funding of the nonfederal share in the amount of \$6,946. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IV.

Washburn Park Board - - Judy Beaudry, Washburn Park Board, presented the request from the park board for \$17,500 in grant funds to develop Nelson Park and Community Garden. The total estimated project cost is \$51,000, which allows for 25% funding of the nonfederal share in the amount of \$12,750. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex V.

McLean County Commission - - Les Hultberg, representing McLean County and Sportsmen Centennial Park, addressed the committee regarding their request of \$6,250 to construct a boat ramp at Sportsmen's Centennial Park. The total estimated project cost is \$100,000. Federal funding is being received in the amount of \$75,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VI.

Rugby Park Board - - Karin Fritel, representing Rugby Park Board and Rugby Jaycees, presented the \$75,000 funding request from the Rugby Park Board for installation of a splashpad at Rugby Jaycees Park in the amount of \$75,000. The total estimated project cost is \$360,807. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VII.

Ms. Fritel indicated a \$200,000 deposit had been made on this project.

Ms. Fritel was informed any expenses paid prior to March 30 toward the project would not be eligible for grant funding. This results in the amount eligible for reimbursement to be lowered from \$75,000 to \$40,202.

Stutsman County Fair Board - - Deb Hatlewick, Secretary, Stutsman County Fair Board, and Kali Lautt, representing Circle Cross Riding Club, presented the funding request from the fair board in the amount of \$8,843 for improvements to the 4-H Horse Arena at the county fairgrounds, including the installation of poles, lights, power and sound. Total estimated project cost is \$35,371. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VIII.

City of Jamestown - - Mayor Heinrich and Tyler Michel, Public Works Director, City of Jamestown, presented the city's request for funding of \$75,000 to assist with the pedestrian bridge replacement project spanning the James River along Klaus, McElroy and Nickeus Parks. The total estimated project cost is \$2,087,917. Federal funding is being received in the amount of \$1,000,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IX.

West Fargo Park District - - Barb Erbstoesser, Executive Director, West Fargo Park District, presented the park district's request for \$24,325 in grant funds for restoration at North Elmwood Park, including ADA restrooms and sidewalk. The total estimated project cost is \$97,290. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex X.

Stutsman County Park Board - - Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, Stutsman County Park Board, presented the park board's request for funding in the amount of \$5,375 to install signage and elevated tent pads with electricity and water and add five electrical pedestals to RV sites at Lakeside Campground located at Jamestown Reservoir. Total estimated project cost is \$22,295, which allows for funding in the amount of \$5,574. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XI.

Jamestown Parks & Recreation - - Amy Walters, Executive Director, Jamestown Parks & Recreation, presented their request of \$50,000 for updates at the Lawrence "Trapper" Softball Field in McElroy Park, which includes the addition of lighting and fencing revisions. The total estimated project cost is \$297,575. Federal funding assistance is being received in the amount of \$148,788. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XII.

It was pointed out to Ms. Walters funding for the three-phase power, transformer upgrade is not eligible for funding under the program guidelines, reducing the amount eligible for funding to \$35,072.

North Dakota State Fair - - Craig Rudland, Assistant General Manager, North Dakota State Fair, addressed the committee regarding the state fair's request for funding assistance in the amount of \$25,000 for installing water and sewage lines at the full-service camping area. The total estimated project cost is \$42,750, which allows for funding in the amount of \$21,375. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIII.

Ward County Parks - - Les Malnaa, Park Supervisor, Ward County Parks, presented their request for funding in the amount of \$2,465 to create a nine-hole disc golf course at Talbott Court Park in Minot. The total estimated project cost is \$9,860. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIV.

Williston Parks & Recreation District - - Joe Barsh, Executive Director, Williston Parks & Recreation District, Nick Liffert and Emily Ramage Gelter, Williston Community Builders, and John Kasmer, Williston business owner, addressed the committee regarding the \$75,000 request for the development of Williston Water World, including construction of an outdoor leisure pool with spray/play features and a lazy river. The total estimated project cost is \$12,661,422. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XV.

City of Wimbledon - - The City of Wimbledon is seeking \$13,000 for bathroom and park upgrades at the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$51,996. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVI.

Bottineau County Commission - - The Bottineau County Commission is requesting \$4,750 for the Turtle Mountain Pickleball Club to construct a pickleball court and add benches and picnic tables, solar lighting and garbage receptacles at East Shore Park in Bottineau. The total estimated project cost is \$19,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVII.

Harwood Park Board - - The City of Harwood's funding request is for \$28,007 to install a splash pad at the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$108,816, which allows for funding in the amount of \$27,204. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVIII.

Tower City Park Board - - The Tower City Park Board is requesting funds in the amount of \$4,700 to construct a pickleball court and four-square space at the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$18,799. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIX.

Grand Forks Park District - - The Grand Forks Park District has requested \$10,000 in grant funds to install family game structures at Lincoln Drive Park. The total estimated project cost is \$40,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XX.

City of Upham - - The City of Upham is requesting \$12,500 to construct ADA compliant restrooms in the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$50,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXI.

City of Butte - - The City of Butte is requesting grant funds in the amount of \$875 for improvements at the city park, including installation of lighting, swings, frisbee golf and tetherball. The total estimated project cost is \$3,495. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXII.

Mohall Park District - - The Mohall Park District requests \$6,875 for Mohall Splash Pad Phase II, consisting of a new waterline at the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$27,500. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIII.

Fairmount Park Board - - The Fairmount Park Board has requested funds in the amount of \$9,750 to install a new free-standing play system for the Fairmount Park Playground Project. The total estimated project cost is \$39,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXIV.

City of Forman - - The City of Forman requests \$2,000 in grant funds for development of Main Street Pocket Park, including a shelter, seating and information placards/panels. The total estimated project cost is \$8,850. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXV.

Finley Park District - - The Finley Park District is requesting \$13,750 to install new playground equipment in the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$110,000. Federal funding assistance is being received in the amount of \$55,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXVI.

CONSIDERATION OF GRANT APPLICATIONS

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$4,750 to the Bottineau County Commission to construct a pickleball court and add benches and picnic tables, solar lighting and garbage receptacles at East Shore Park in Bottineau.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$27,204 to the Harwood Park Board to construct a splash pad at North Acres Park in Harwood.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$24,323 to the West Fargo Park District to install ADA compliant restrooms and sidewalk at North Elmwood Park in West Fargo.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$4,700 to the Tower City Park Board to install a pickleball court and four-square space at the city park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$10,000 to the Grand Forks Park District to install concrete family game structures at Lincoln Drive Park in Grand Forks.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$12,500 to the City of Upham to construct ADA compliant restrooms at the city park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$40,071 to the McKenzie County Park Board for construction of a new shower/bathroom facility at Tobacco Gardens Recreation Area on Lake Sakakawea.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$874 to the City of Butte for improvements at the city park, including installation of lighting, swings, frisbee golf and tetherball.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$6,946 to the McLean County Fair Board to construct a structure to house the announcer stand for the horse arena and concession area.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$12,750 to the Washburn Park Board for development of Nelson Park and Community Garden.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$6,250 to the McLean County Commission for construction of a boat ramp at Sportsmen's Centennial Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$40,202 to the Rugby Park Board for construction of a splash pad at Rugby Jaycees Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$6,875 to the Mohall Park District/City of Mohall for Phase II construction of the Mohall Splash Pad, consisting of the installation of a two-inch waterline.

Up to 50 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$21,375 to the North Dakota State Fair for installation of water and sewage lines at the full-service camping area.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$2,465 to Ward County Parks to create a nine-hole disc golf course at Talbott Court Park in Minot.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$75,000 to the Williston Parks & Recreation District for the development of Williston Water World, including construction of an outdoor leisure pool with spray/play features and a lazy river.

Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Forde, Johnson, Klein, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Recreation Grant Additional Project Information

Description of Project:

This project is being sponsored by the City of Jamestown, but future maintenance will be done by the Jamestown Park and Recreation District. The City of Jamestown and the Jamestown Park and Recreation District have entered into a Joint Powers Agreement in order to construct, maintain and address future expenses. A copy of the JPA is attached.

Our project will address replacement of the pedestrian bridges that span the James River at Klaus, Nickeus and McElroy parks. In all three situations the bridges connect City of Jamestown right of way to Jamestown Parks and Recreation land. The bridges are beyond their lifespan and action needs to be taken to replace the bridges and renovate the adjoining pathways to ensure they are accessible and can be used by all community members. Not only do these bridges provide an entry point to the parks for recreation but they also serve as important pedestrian routes that community members may use to travel to essential services such as schools, grocery stores, pharmacies, and medical providers.

This project would remove the old bridges and replace all the existing abutments on the projects and install a prefabricated pedestrian bridge. All three of these sites have poor or nonexistent abutments. All sites also lack proper ADA access across the bridges. These bridges would provide a safe and lighted path for pedestrians. In addition, the current bridges are low and could potentially exacerbate conditions in a flood situation due to obstructing the water flow and holding floating debris or ice. The selected bridges will be designed and installed to meet the requirements for regulatory floodway and the projects would improve the hydraulics of the river at these intersections. The Klaus Park bridge will require significant work on the East access point to ensure compliance with ADA standards and provide a scenic pedestrian overlook that will be installed on the existing riverbank that encompasses the view of Klaus Park.

While not preferred, due to efficiency, this project could be broken down into phases. There is significant cost savings to the project by mobilizing contractors and supplies all at one time. Priority of installation of new bridges are as follows:

- 1. Klaus Park
- 2. Nickeus Park
- 3. McElroy Park

Current Sites:

The three project sites all have varying issues. It is unlikely the bridges meet ADA requirements. The new bridges will all be designed and built with ADA rules in mind.

The Klaus Park bridge enters from Fourth Street Southwest and crosses the James River into the east edge of Klaus Park. The bridge has sidewalk feeding it, but the area is overgrown with vegetation, unlit, and is generally unkempt. The bridge itself is past its useful life. The abutments have been eroded by the James River during numerous high-water events over the years. The new bridge would be placed above the floodplain and with input from the Army Corps of Engineers and Bureau of Reclamation to

ensure viability. The entrance would be lit, vegetation would be cleared and landscaped, and would be more welcoming to all users.

The Nickeus Park Bridge has many of the same issues as Klaus. The bridge spans from the Right of Way at the intersection of First Ave North and Eighth Street North and crosses the James River into the south portion of Nickeus Park. There are multiple sidewalks in the area that connect to this bridge. The entrance is dark and unwelcoming. The bridge is low and a catch point for large items such as trees and other debris floating down the river during high water events. The new bridge will be well lit, outside of the floodplain, and landscaped and cleaned up to become a more inviting presence. The new bridge would also be constructed with input from the Army Corps of Engineers and Bureau of Reclamation.

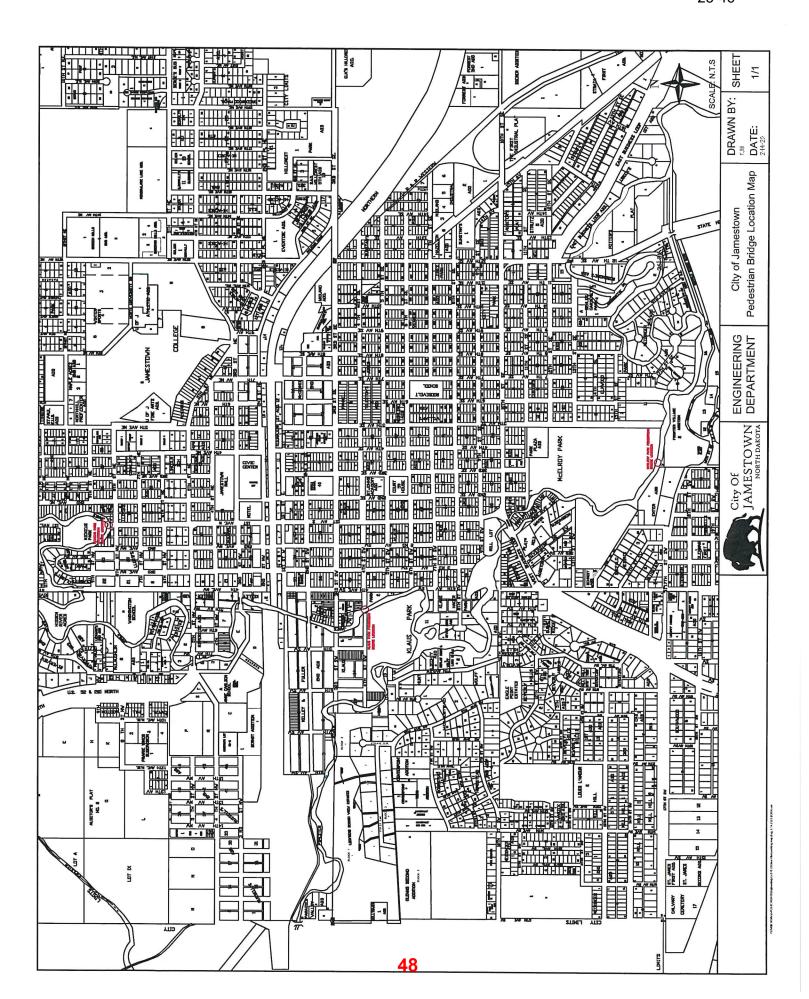
The McElroy Park Bridge is a somewhat newer bridge. It was remodeled sometime during the late 1990s or early 2000s. It is a wooden bridge that sees quite a bit of bicycle traffic, as it accesses the trail system to the south of the James River. The bridge connects the south end of McElroy Park to a large piece of City of Jamestown owned property that contains bicycle and walking trails, as well as access to the back side of the Frontier Village in south Jamestown. The area is well lit and sees quite a bit of activity. The new bridge would include improved lighting and landscaping. Once again, the new bridge would be constructed with input from the Army Corps of Engineers and Bureau of Reclamation.

Supporting Data:

In 2015 Forward Jamestown: A Community-Based Land Use and Transportation Plan (LUTP) was developed "as a plan for the future, of how a city can move forward in new ways, while maintaining the qualities and values in which it takes both pride and comfort". In Chapter Ten of the LUTP it lists as part of the Active Transportation Priorities a new bridge in Klaus Park to create a complete east-west pedestrian and bicycle connection. This bridge replacement is part of the overall transportation plan to connect the west central side of Jamestown with the remainder of the city. As per Chapter 6 of the LUTP existing park facilities are disconnected and provide a challenge to creating a fully connected system. Replacing these bridges, in alignment with current accessibility standards, will improve active transportation in the community and serve as progress towards the goal of a fully connected community. The attached Bridge Access Maps indicate that by providing the bridges and accessible pathways through the parks significant time and distance will be saved by pedestrians. Condition Assessment North shelter – 30' x 80' Elmwood Park in West Fargo, ND

On June 28, 2022 a condition assessment was done on the above listed building. Building is 30'- x 80' slab on grade wood pole type building. Wood poles are 8" diameter at 10'-0"o.c., roof structure is wood trusses at 2'-0"o.c.. There are gravity type doors on the north and south side located between posts. Roof is wood decking with asphalt shingles, there are skylights. East end has electrical panel, service sink, toilets, and storage.

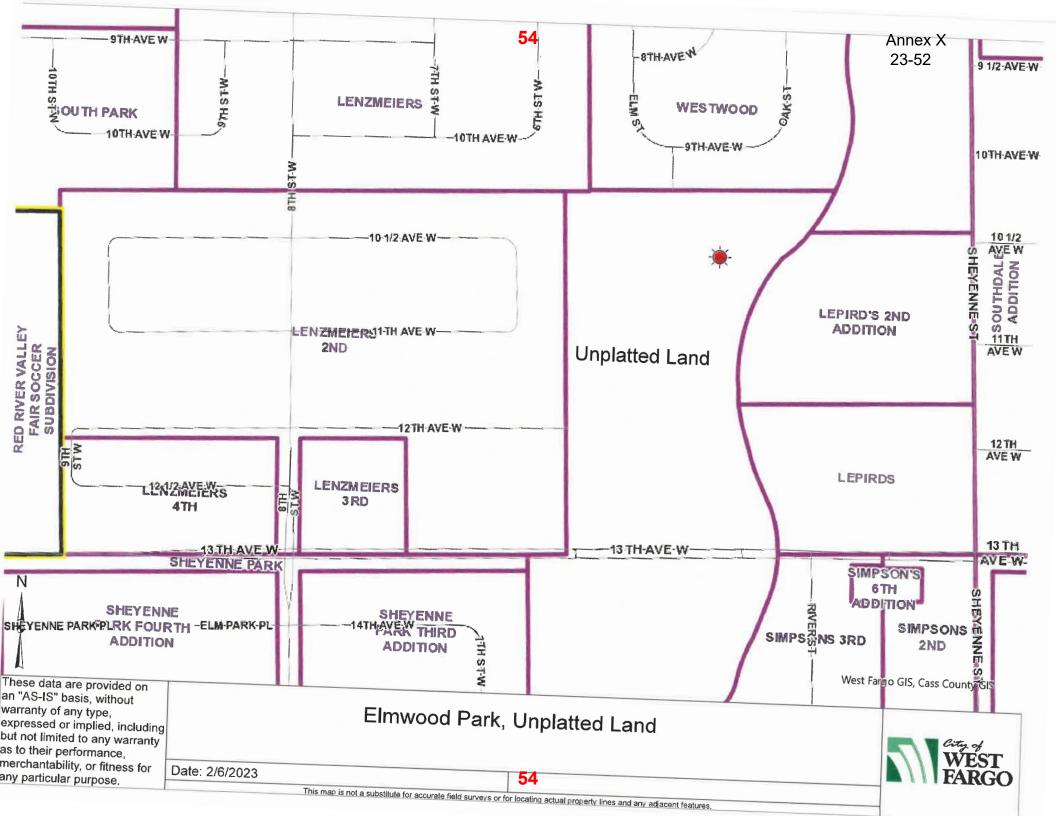

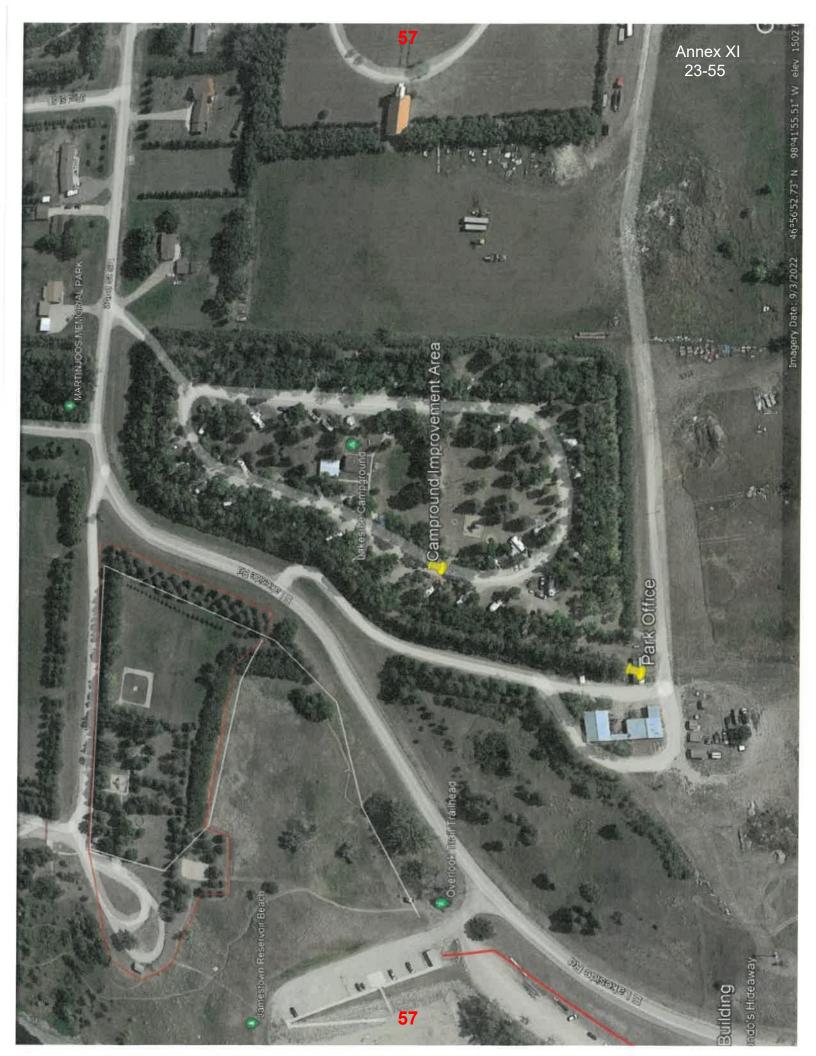

Description of Project:

Updates and revisions to Lawrence "Trapper" Softball Field at McElroy Park in Jamestown, ND. The updates will include the addition of lighting and accompanied fencing revisions at the only competitive fast pitch softball field in the community. Currently there are no lights on any fast pitch softball fields in the community. This would be the first-time teams would be able to play past sunset. Stakeholder groups including, Jamestown Public Schools, University of Jamestown, Jamestown "Outlaws" Frontier Fastpitch Softball, Jamestown Men's Softball Association and Jamestown Women's Slow Pitch Softball were consulted in the development of this plan.

The physical improvements at the field will include the installation of LED lights with concrete bases, galvanized steel poles, remote electrical component enclosures, pole length wire harnesses and factory-aimed and assembled luminaries. Additional improvements will include the required electrical service of 480V/3 phase power to the site, a new electrical transformer, and necessary movement and reinstallation of fencing on the first and third baseline to the outfield.

Audience Intended to be Served:

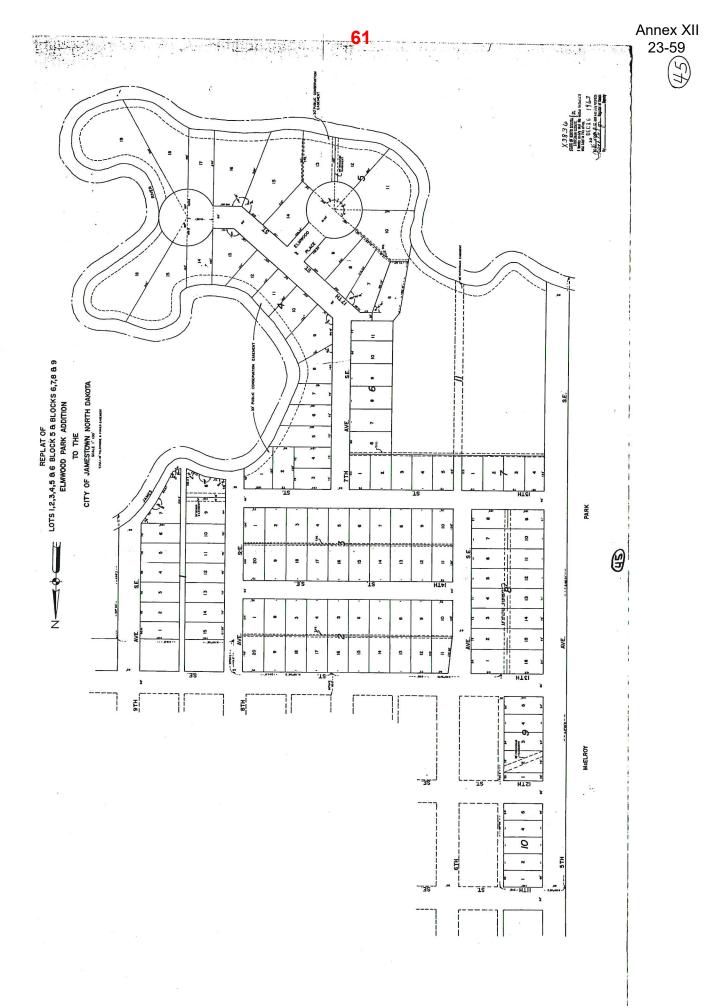
Currently the facility serves the following constituents as detailed below.

- 120 local players age 5-18 registered in Outlaws youth fast pitch programs
- 40 middle school and high school players (some duplication with the above)
- 30 University of Jamestown players
- 12,000 visits to Trapper Field and McElroy Park softball fields seasonally
- Host to several state and regional tournaments to include the NDHSAA Class A and B fast pitch softball yearly. Host all State Amateur tournaments for 3 divisions.

By adding lighting to Trapper Field it extends the "playable" hours of the facility. This is especially critical in the Spring and Fall seasons as sunset occurs earlier. Having extended playable hours will impact all user groups, both adult and youth, as well as competitive and recreational leagues. Currently the number of teams in recreational leagues are limited based upon the number of games that can be played each day. In addition, lighting and fence realignment will improve safety for the players. With the new lighting system Trapper Field will be in compliance with facility requirements for hosting state and regional tournaments.

Describe Project Site As Is and Proposed Changes:

The site is currently a fast pitch softball field located within McElroy Park. The proposed changes would include the installation of lighting and revisions to the first and third baseline fencing that would be disrupted due to the required location of the light poles.

ABOUT LINCOLN DRIVE PARK

Lincoln Drive Park is a large park adjacent to the Red River which was created in an area that was once a neighborhood before the flood of 1997. The park is a popular spot for weddings, family gatherings and graduations. Amenities at the park include a playground, horseshoe pits, community room/warming house, sledding hill, dog park, ice skating rink, frisbee golf course, picnic shelters for rental, bench seating in various areas, and landscape areas. The Greenway Bike Path runs through the park and there is a boat ramp to the Red River.

OUR REQUEST

Near the entrance of this large and popular park in Grand Forks are nine horseshoe pits surrounded by a concrete border. An aerial view of the pits is included with this grant application. We will refer to this specific tract as a *family games area*. This area has been worn down with time and has surpassed its useful life. An assessment of the family games area concluded that a better use of the space would be to remove most of the horseshoe pits and provide other family game type structures in their place.



A plan has been drawn up by the Grand Forks Park District to restructure the family game area with three horseshoe pits, two cornhole pits, and several other concrete gaming structures such as foosball, disc-connect, ladder-golf, ping pong and GaGa ball. A rough drawing of the current plan is included with this grant application. Pictures, proposals and quotes for the gaming items have also been included with this grant application.

Once the new family gaming structures are constructed, some fencing and signage will also be added along with the potential of more tables and grills depending on space and aesthetics.

The Grand Forks Park District is asking the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District to help finance 25% of the costs of the construction of this new family games area at Lincoln Drive Park. The remaining costs of the project will be financed by the Grand Forks Park District.

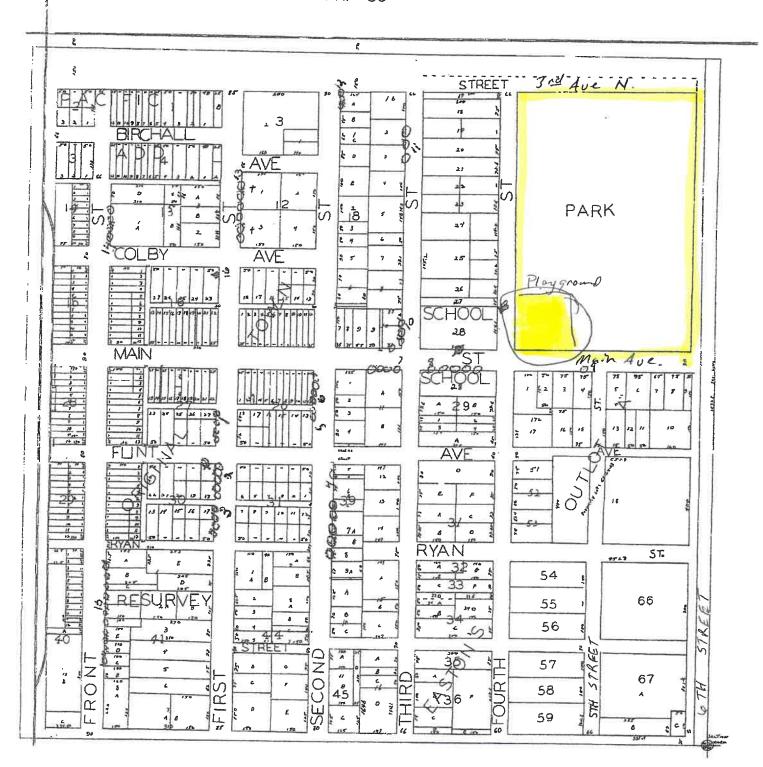

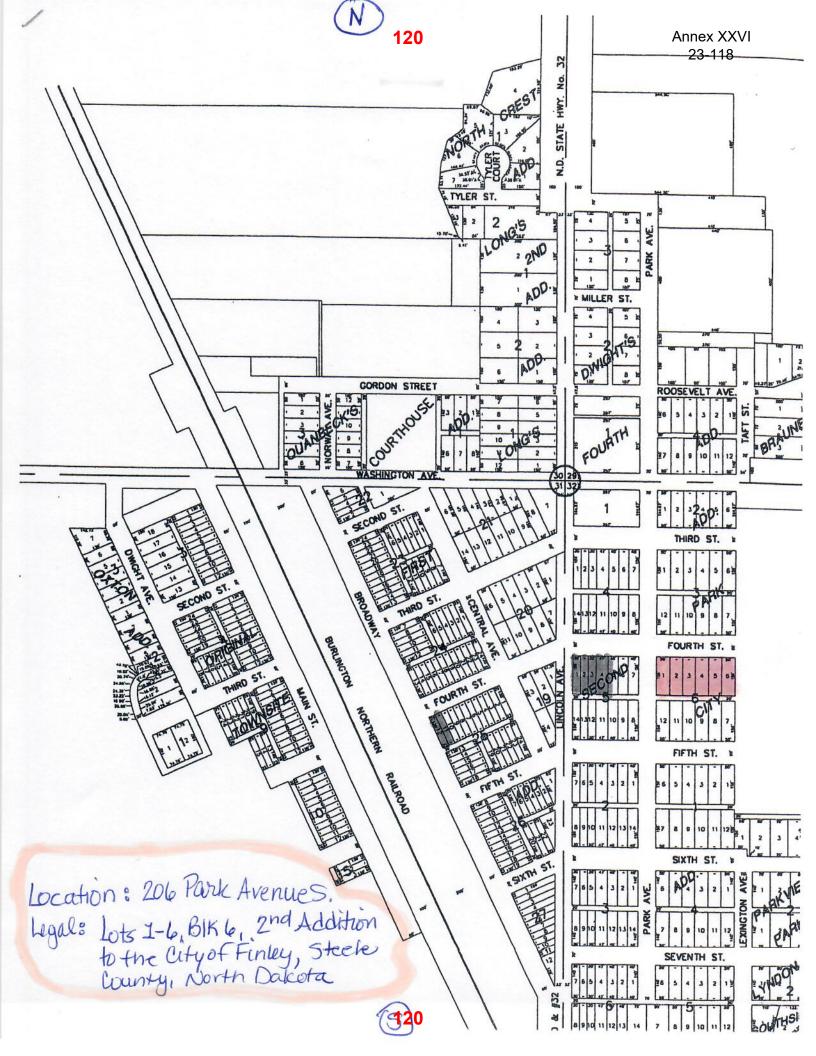
Hello Chad,

Here is a design that I came up with for your park. We would need to verify the dimensions, but I think this would fit within the space you have available after removing the items we discussed. The cost for the equipment shown would be \$62,045.00 materials delivered. The bordering would be \$4,660.00, that includes a full ADA ramp, same type of bordering that you currently have around the equipment, black poly. You would need about 175-185 cubic yards of engineered wood fibers, the cost for that delivered would be approximately \$6,500.00. These costs for the bordering and wood fibers are based on current pricing, I added a little to them to try to cover the for 2023 increases, but once it gets closer to the time of purchase we would need to make sure all costs are updated, I think for grant purposes this should be fine. The good thing about the structure I used is that is comes in 2 phases, so if all the money wasn't available at one time we could do all the other work and leave the right side open for expansion and then once funding became available we could add phase 2. The structure total is \$44,562.00, phase 1 is \$18,165.00 and phase 2 is \$26,397.00. Like I said, the prices I gave you are inflated to reflect 2023 prices, this could change but overall I think you are safe to use these as budgetary numbers. When writing grants I tell everyone to add 30% to the materials costs to account for installation. The supervisory option for 1 day is \$1,765.00, if you had 10-12 good volunteers you could get close to knocking this out in 1 day, whatever would be left to do, like the bordering and surfacing and maybe some finishing work wouldn't require a supervisory to be on site, he would leave you with the knowledge to finish up. Obviously we can discuss all this in more detail, I wanted to get you over some preliminary numbers and a design to look at to get your boards feedback. 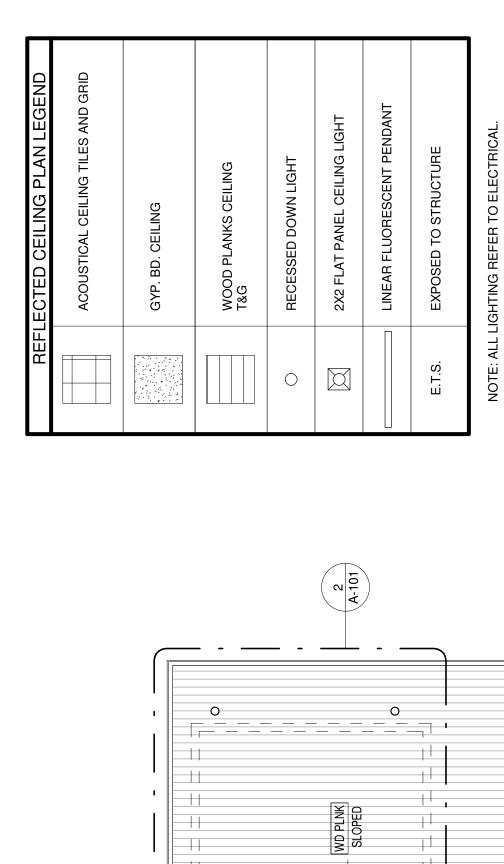
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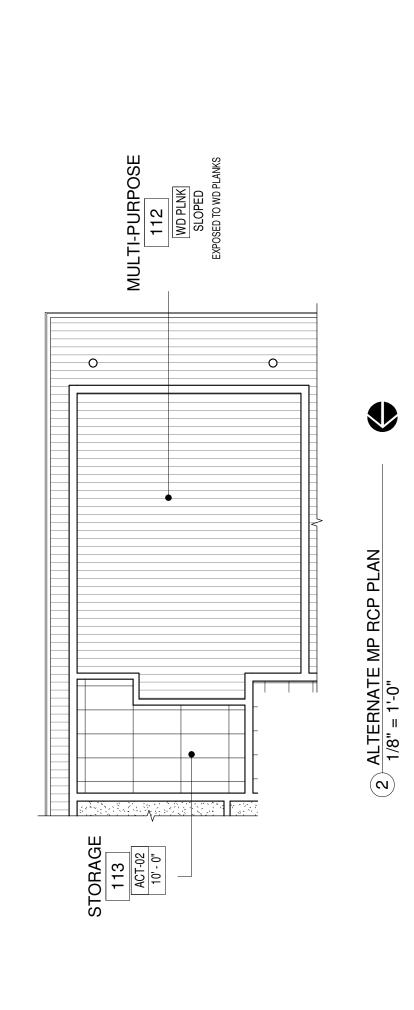

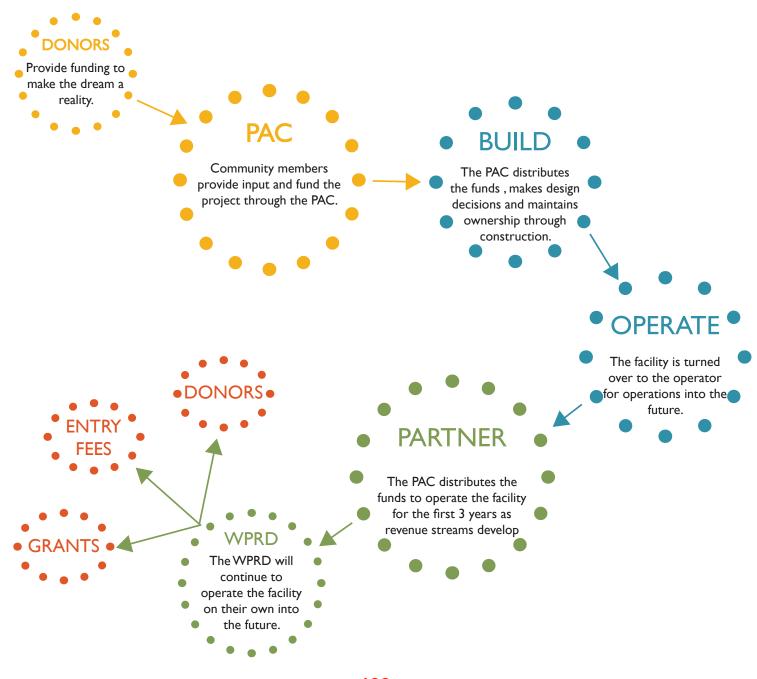

Recreation Grant Program Policy Statement

MATCHING RECREATION GRANT PROGRAM

The Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Board of Directors instituted a matching recreation grant program and established that funds for the grant program will consist of two-tenths of the mill levy Garrison Diversion receives. Grants may be requested for new recreation facilities and enhancement or expansion of existing facilities.

ELIGIBILITY

Political subdivisions (park boards, water resource districts and county or city commissioners, etc.) located within the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District may apply for a matching grant. **Community groups, service clubs and non-profit organizations are not eligible to apply for funding.**

Single-county sponsored projects located within Garrison Diversion boundaries may be eligible to receive up to 25% of the non-federal share. Multiple-county sponsored projects located within Garrison Diversion boundaries may be eligible for up to 50% of the non-federal share. To be considered for a 50% non-federal cost share, more than one county must contribute substantial funds to the project.

SCOPE OF PROJECTS

Eligible projects may encompass a variety of components which provide actual, or are a complement to, natural resource outdoor recreational opportunities. Projects may include, but are not limited to: boat ramps and docks; picnic facilities; restrooms; campgrounds; bathhouses; playground areas; and bicycle, pedestrian, or horse trails.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The Recreation Committee meets biannually to consider grant applications. Application and required documentation must be postmarked or received electronically by March 1 or September 1 to be considered at the next meeting.

The application must include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Audience intended to be served
- 2. Breakdown of estimated costs, including future operations and maintenance
- 3. Predicted source of all funding
- 4. Plans for new construction

GUIDELINES FOR ALL APPLICANTS

- Applications must include a list of all funding sources applied for and amounts received.
- All projects must have long-term managing partners with operation and maintenance funds available for the life of the project.
- Applicants requesting \$25,000 or more are encouraged to attend the Recreation Committee meeting to present the project and answer questions from the committee.

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GARRISON DIVERSION CONSERVANCY DISTRICT

Recreation Grant Program Policy Statement

ELIGIBLE PROJECT COSTS

Site planning costs, including engineering costs, may be included as eligible project costs. Individual projects are eligible to receive up to a maximum of \$75,000 award.

Only costs incurred after the date of grant approval by Garrison Diversion will be eligible for reimbursement.

Money to be credited as the local sponsor's share of the project may be raised in a number of ways and may consist of actual dollars or in-kind donations of labor, materials and equipment costs.

NON-ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

Types of projects or elements of projects that are not qualified to receive funding:

- 1. Maintenance of an existing facility/structure, i.e. painting/staining, re-reroofing, etc.
- 2. Any type of facility used for maintenance equipment or the purchase of maintenance equipment
- 3. Development, enhancement or maintenance of roads to or within facilities
- 4. Water lines, sewer lines and electrical services to facilities other than immediate hookups.
- 5. Projects on private property without a public interest to the land
- 6. Projects on school property
- 7. Shore stabilization including riprap
- 8. Any project that does not meet current ADA standards
- 9. Land acquisition costs will not be considered eligible for reimbursement; the land valuation may not be credited toward the local sponsor's match.
- 10. Projects that do not allow reasonable access by the public
- 11. Golf courses, hockey arenas, monument type veteran/public servant memorials, or art/theatre projects

If your submitted application includes any of the non-qualified components listed above, the application will be returned for resubmission before the corresponding deadline.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPROVED GRANTS

Following completion of the project and verification of expenditures, reimbursement will be made by Garrison Diversion. Partial payment requests may be made at the discretion of the project sponsor. Projects receiving grants over \$5,000 will be provided a sign, paid for by the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, naming major sponsors of the project.

Approved recreation projects have three years to be completed. If the project has not been completed within that time frame, the sponsoring agency will need to report to the Recreation Committee in order to retain any unused funds, or the unused funds will be returned to Garrison Diversion's recreation grant pool.

Project Summary

This project consists of building six new pickleball courts at Hi-Line Park in the southwest corner. The West North Central Region, which includes North Dakota, shows the fastest growth in pickleball players at 29.8% year-over-year in 2022 (pickleballheads.com). Just in our community, we have seen a tremendous increase in participation with our indoor pickleball. We are currently offering pickleball four days a week for both open and league play but could use more space. All are welcome to play pickleball hosted by the park district. A variety of levels are offered, ranging from open play geared more towards beginners to competitive tournaments. When we first started offering pickleball in 2018, it was a small group made up of mostly senior couples just wanting to play for fun. Since then, we have expanded to leagues with participants of all ages and have been able to put on a few tournaments. From a recreation standpoint, it has been enjoyable to see players improve their skills along with the expansion of the sport.

When we first offered pickleball, we started small because we were unsure of how many people would participate. We bought two portable nets, 10 sets of paddles and a handful of indoor balls. That original group was made up of about five couples that would play when they could. Those couple slowly started to encourage friends and family to come try playing. Things snowballed from there and the league grew to over 50 people in a matter of a few weeks. We also have people traveling from smaller towns outside of Valley City, Jamestown and Fargo coming to take part in our leagues. Some nights during open play, we have people sitting in the bleachers waiting to play because we just don't have the room for more courts. Due to the increase in participation, we had to get more equipment to accommodate the higher numbers. We now have 10 portable nets, over 25 sets of paddles and indoor and outdoor balls in an array of colors. We have even had some of our more dedicated pickleball players donate packs of balls to make sure we never run out. All this equipment is used between the Rec Center and Wellness Center. These amenities are great for all kinds of indoor pickleball play but doesn't solve the problems of lack of outdoor courts or allowing people to play year-round.

We feel the addition of permanent courts will allow us to offer pickleball year-round and grow interest in the sport. Due to the growing participation in pickleball and the exercise benefits for all who play, we want to be able to offer pickleball year-round without the conflict that comes when playing with blended lines on a tennis court. Right now, all organized pickleball is located inside our Rec Center (there is open pickleball at the Wellness Center but that is not nearly as competitive as league play at the Rec Center). This works during the school year but as soon as summer hits, the Rec Center gets extremely busy with youth basketball camps, youth volleyball camps and tournaments and a variety of other activities put on by different clubs along with park district events. We feel like having courts already set up at a permanent facility will allow for people to try playing on their own, which could lead to them playing in leagues. We have snowbirds in our community come back for summer raving about the outdoor facilities they have played at in warmer states. Besides talking about how nice those facilities are, they also ask when we are getting a facility like that. Not only would permanent courts improve pickleball in

Valley City, but it would also be the only outdoor facility between Bismarck and Fargo (almost a 200-mile radius).

Exercise is one of the most underutilized ways to improve someone's mental health. Another way is to get outside. This past winter alone we had snow from November to mid-April. In that time, we had a handful of blizzards shutting down businesses and the schools. Harsh winters make getting outside even more important in the summer. Having options to play pickleball through league play or playing on your own combines being outside and getting some exercise. Sports, in general, are also a great way for people to socialize and find a sense of belonging in a community.

Market Analysis

We feel there is an existing market with the leagues/open play that we run. Our Monday night league at the Rec. Center is at capacity with the four courts we currently set up in there. There is also a more competitive/invite only group that meets on Wednesday evenings in the school to play. We held our 1st outdoor pickleball tournament last year and the participants from all over the state including Bismarck and Devils Lake were excited to participate gave us some suggestions and are looking forward to coming back. We feel having exclusive pickleball courts will attract people from all around to come to Valley City.

We will market our leagues and tournaments through various media types, we have found great success with joining social media groups that have formed in other communities like Bismarck pickleball and informing them of what we have going on in our community.

The biggest obstacle we will face is hopefully not having enough courts, visiting other communities once these are established they become very busy.

According to USA Pickleball, pickleball has more than "4.8 million participants nationwide, and a growth of 39.3% over the last two years." The sport has been the fastest growing sport in the nation for two consecutive years. As pickleball is still an upand-coming sport in North Dakota, there is a great deal of untapped potential with growing the sport. By bringing in more courts to Valley City, particularly outdoor, pickleball-exclusive courts, we are able to tap into the growing needs of the pickleball community and offer something that no one in the area can.

This means creating pickleball tournaments, bettering the Valley City economy, and creating a unique community for these athletes to enjoy.

The projected budget (detailed attached) is \$500,135. We came up with this number after numerous phone calls to get estimates on what we are looking at, this project will require us to hire an engineer and to seek bids.

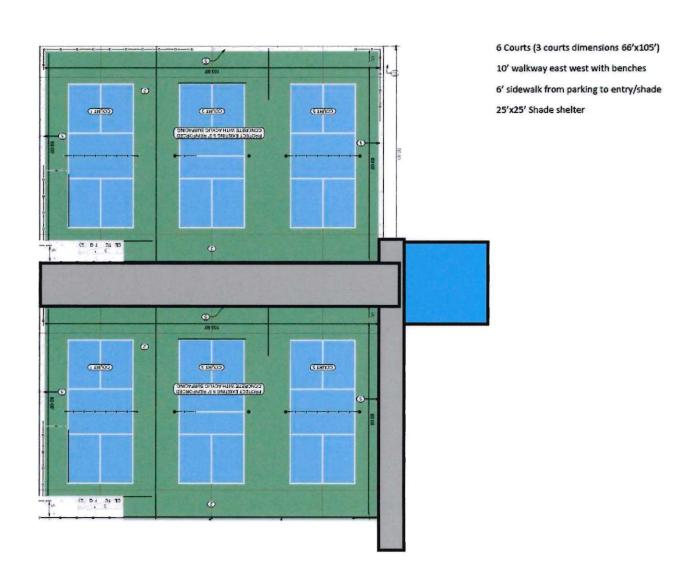
We would start with the design and specs as soon as possible. We may start some of the site work this fall, but the majority of the work would happen in 2024 with completion in the summer of 2024.

<u>Description of Project Features:</u>

The project consists of a 10' wide concrete shared use path along ND Highway 18 with a crossing over Swan Creek. The path will connect residential neighborhoods to multiple recreation destinations, including the city pool, an indoor waterpark, a fitness center, along with other commercial destinations. The crossing of Swan Creek, which would otherwise be a barrier, provides recreational opportunities for enjoying the creek corridor and admiring the prairie landscape. home and provide the city with a recreational escape. A sledding hill will provide the Ellendale

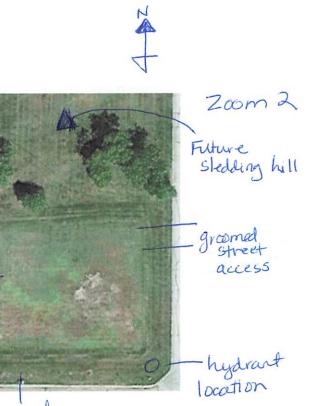
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community with another venue at which they can develop a sense of community and commitment to the neighbors and community members.

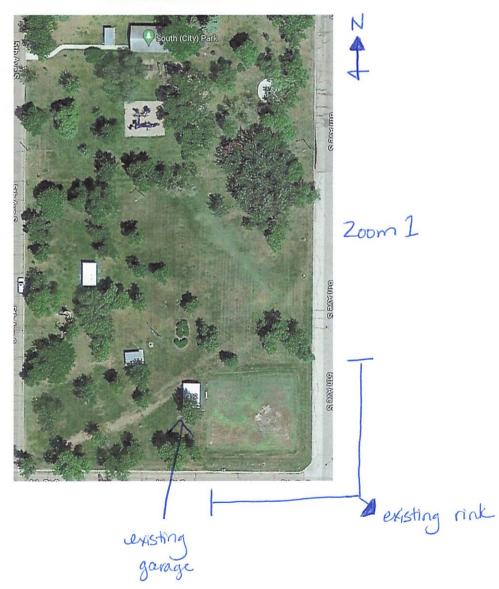

Detailed Project Description:

The lot is about 75 feet wide and approximately 120 feet deep. There is currently grass planted and a few trees but until now, no group has taken the time or made the effort to develop it further. There is very little public seating along our Main Street and absolutely no outdoor seating, despite having a coffee and ice cream shop next door to this space.

We want to create a community gathering and outdoor event space that could be used for outdoor performances, outdoor eating, and community gatherings. Included is a covered pavilion that will provide an outdoor space that doesn't currently exist in Oakes.

Our plan was designed to create a multi-purpose, flexible, and collaborative design so we could maximize the investment by serving the most people and needs.

Our community has a large number of public parks and most of them are built and designed to support the outdoor play of children. There isn't a single park in our community designed specifically for the enrichment of our community or one that is fully ADA-compliant.

We believe that vibrant, aesthetically appealing spaces create the kind of community that people want to live in, ensuring this project makes an important economic development impact. Quality of life includes feeling a sense of belonging, and with this space, organic connection among community members will happen through day-to-day interactions, along with facilitated gatherings through more formally planned activities and events.

We believe in the power of the arts and the impact that they have on our mental health and overall social and emotional well-being. On each side of our park, we are working with the respective building owners to include the exteriors of their buildings in our design.

We plan to contract with a muralist to create a full building mural on each exterior wall that flanks the park. This will warm up the space and help us create the kind of inspiring environment that allows us to think more creatively.

We will also include locally designed sculptures for the park. These have not been contracted yet, but the goal is to create something of historical significance to our community or the state of North Dakota.

We believe in the value of multi-generational interactions. Our ADA-compliant design in the space provides another way for people of all ages and abilities to engage with one another and their natural environment.

We want to install two water features, lending a pleasant and appealing sound to the overall tranquility and peace of the space.

The beautifully designed planting beds create a connection to nature that currently can't be found along Main Street.

We see the importance of giving more prominence to the flagpoles in the area. They aren't given any reverence in their current location and moving them in a mindful way in our design would allow them to be featured.

The outdoor stage is a key component of our design.

We want this space to be the kind of place where people *want* to be and having a stage where we can bring in entertainers, speakers, and other acts creates a reason to come to Main Street.

Much of our concept is modeled after Block 9 in downtown Fargo which offers many of the same amenities and features. With Fargo being the biggest city in the state of North Dakota, people expect to find a park like this there and The Kilbourne Group is a developer happy to pay for the creation of the space; people do not expect a small community to deliver a similar concept nor do we have a developer locally that would take it on.

We have considered how to "right-size" this project to our community, but the basics of solid placemaking hold in a town regardless of size; we are just far less likely to get our local government to step forward and offer to help.

We almost have to build this project privately or through grants such as this one being offered through Garrison Diversion Conservancy District. With the incredible partnerships we've already developed within Oakes, we believe that with the right support, we can make this happen, even if we're approaching it in an unconventional manner.

Project Status and Timeline:

This project is already underway as we've already purchased the lot, met with various stakeholder groups to determine the need and desire for the project's success and to determine which organization would take ownership of the project management and ongoing maintenance of the park once completed.

We'd like to complete this project as soon as possible having already installed the entire paver walkways and patio.

Expected Town Outcomes:

All small towns across America are struggling to remain relevant and survive, let alone grow and thrive.

Oakes is a strong, vibrant community and this project will help us achieve the following outcomes:

- A connection to nature by activating the only greenspace in our business district
- Creation of a dedicated placemaking location
- Support for community engagement and a sense of belonging among our residents
- A fostering of the arts and culture that is so often overlooked in a community the size of Oakes
- Main Street vibrancy and an enhanced business climate in Oakes
- Increased tourism opportunities

Preservation of Greenspace

It's true that Oakes as a community has a great selection of parks with plenty of equipment to support the activity and health of the youth in our community. The reason for the emphasis on the activation of this space is that we'd be preserving the only greenspace along Main Street. By enhancing the space with plantings and a water feature, we'll be encouraging people to spend more time outside enjoying nature. Allowing for winter activities in North Dakota can be tricky; we'd have many opportunities to develop interesting winter options in this park given the design.

Placemaking as a Community Development Strategy

Entire organizations now exist only to discuss different strategies for improving placemaking activities as a core part of community development. In a rural community like Oakes, being geographically positioned far from bigger communities, we must have a dedicated space to conduct these kinds of activities or they simply don't happen.

Now more than ever, people are attracted to towns with vibrant, interesting places and this park is an ideal location in the heart of Main Street to serve as this dedicated space.

Increased Community Engagement and A Sense of Belonging

People won't stay in a community unless they feel they belong to the community. This deeply felt sense of belonging can be intentionally fostered through spaces like the one we've proposed.

This is why we decided to take on this project, rather than going with the traditional route of having it owned by the city or the park board. Even though both are public entities, the need for regulations, rules, and control can create barriers to access for all individuals.

We want to make sure everyone feels like this park belongs to them.

Fostering Arts and Culture

One of the key facets of high quality of life in a community is having interesting things to do and ways to personally grow; the arts create avenues for both.

Small towns are often passed over for quality arts programming and this park will offer not only visibly displayed art for people to appreciate and enjoy, but the outdoor amphitheater offers many options for experiencing performing arts.

With our ideas for closing down the 500 block of Main Street and hosting fairs and festivals more regularly with the park being a central element, our residents will have a much bigger slate of arts and cultural activities to participate in than we currently offer.

Main Street Vibrancy and Improved Business Climate

Our friend and community development strategist, Jeff Siegler of Revitalize or Die, has said, "Expecting a city to function without a downtown is like building a home with only bedrooms; yes, you can reside there, but you cannot live there."

The development of this community park simply presents an opportunity to further enhance the appeal of our downtown area.

When our dead spaces get activated, everyone benefits.

The longer periods of time people spend downtown, the more money they'll spend in our locally owned businesses.

When we look good, we feel good, and this investment could even encourage other business owners to perk their storefronts to match the overall aesthetic of an improved downtown.

Increased Tourism

Oakes already boasts a great golf course, business economy, and is known for its excellent hunting and fishing.

But like many small towns, we do not have a specific landmark or other tourist attraction by which to encourage visitors.

All the tourism we see in Oakes is created by us as a community.

Having such an incredible outdoor space to host events gives us additional reasons to encourage people to visit us.

Permits Needed

In terms of permitting, the only document required by the City of Oakes is the Application for Building Permit, which has already been submitted.

It's a simple form that we've already completed and submitted to our city government for processing.

Partnership:

We are working with many different organizations to put this idea together and one of the long-term benefits is simply the pride we'd always have for what we can build when we rise up and rally around an idea.

Most of the people involved in this project have a long-term focus on why we want to develop this space. Yes, we'll all benefit right now, but the investments we make now aren't for just our benefit—they are for the future residents and visitors to the Oakes community.

Connections made today may inspire businesses and relationships that blossom into future opportunities.

Across Rural America, it's believed that civic pride and engagement levels are falling. Another long-term benefit of a public project of this scale is that the students that are involved with the process can see how even small towns like Oakes can come together to create something truly wonderful. They will be able to see their individual ability to contribute to the vibrancy of their community.

When we open ourselves up to collaboration and invite others to share their ideas, our initial idea only gets better. Yes, it's a bit more chaotic and at times, a bit messier, but the outcome is always richer with more stakeholders and more sources of inspiration.

With this project, we're demonstrating what an entrepreneurial mindset can look like in a small town. Who knows what other pockets of development might be inspired by seeing this vision come to life?

Financially, we have secured just over \$83,000 from individual contributors through a concerted fundraising effort carried out by the Chamber Board (11 members), the Chamber Director, and our Economic Developer.

We intend to ask for support from our local economic development organization.

To help with the costs associated with installing metal art sculptures and painted murals on the sidewalls of the park, we'll likely pursue art grants at the state or federal level.

We will also apply to our local community foundation when their grant cycle opens in October.

We applied to 4 different grants with requests totaling \$122,500, receiving only \$500. These were highly competitive grants.

We're working with the Oakes Active Arts Club to identify local artists for both the metal sculptures and building murals. They'll not only help with the overall design aesthetic but also be one of the key organizations to use the space to support their mission of advancing the arts in our region.

As the Chamber of Commerce, we are thrilled to offer the use of this park as a key benefit as part of our suite of membership benefits to the over 125 businesses that comprise our membership.

We are partnering with our local Girl and Boy Scout groups to get the troops to participate in the actual renovation work. Three young women have identified specific elements of the park design to both fundraise for and build for their projects. Molly Sitzler selected the amphitheater, Megan Miller selected the seating, and Mallory Domine chose the landscaping. A requirement of their projects is that they identify a community team to help them, so they have identified the specific individuals in Oakes that will be on their project teams, which creates even more collaboration and creativity among our community members.

Rhett Miller, a local Boy Scout, has identified the paver path as his Eagle Scout project. He, too, will be doing additional fundraising and is responsible for managing the entire project related to the paver patio and walkway.

Rhett completed this portion of the project on August 10, 2023.

We'll also use a variety of local businesses to support the design, renovation, and future maintenance of this project.

Phillip Homan, a local landscape architect, and owner of Homan Design Group, designed our initial plan and collected bids to help us develop an initial scope of work.

The rendering is attached as part of our packet, along with photos of the current state of the park and the completed paver project.

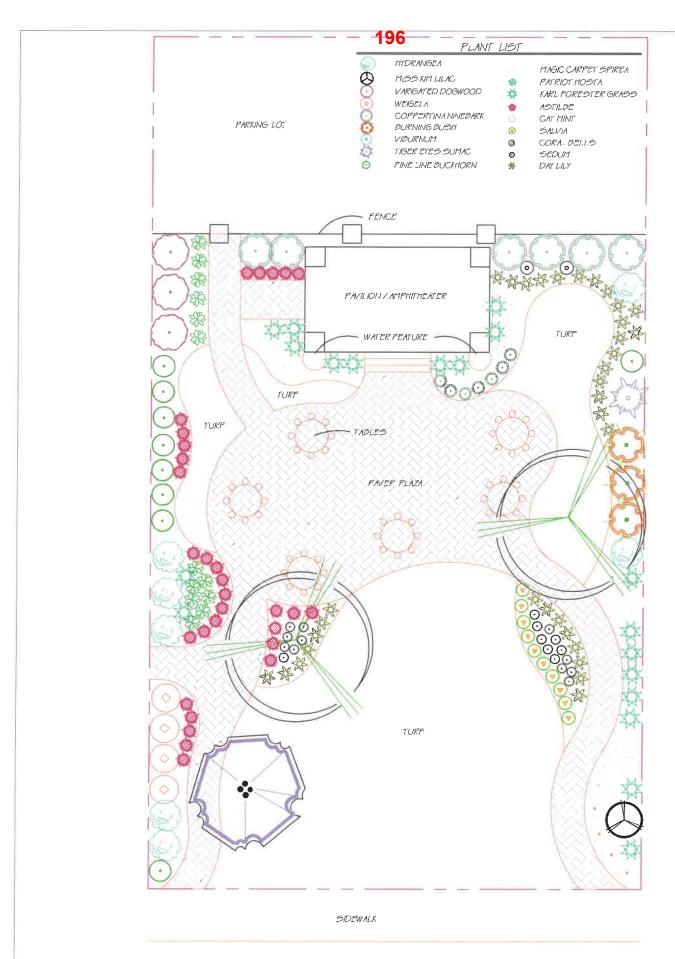
To purchase plantings and shrubs, we'd work with Phillip along with B & B Gardens, our local greenhouse.

For the seating solutions manufactured by our students, we're working with three different metal fabricators in Oakes: Harris Machine Company, Kustom Machine, and Design Manufacturing.

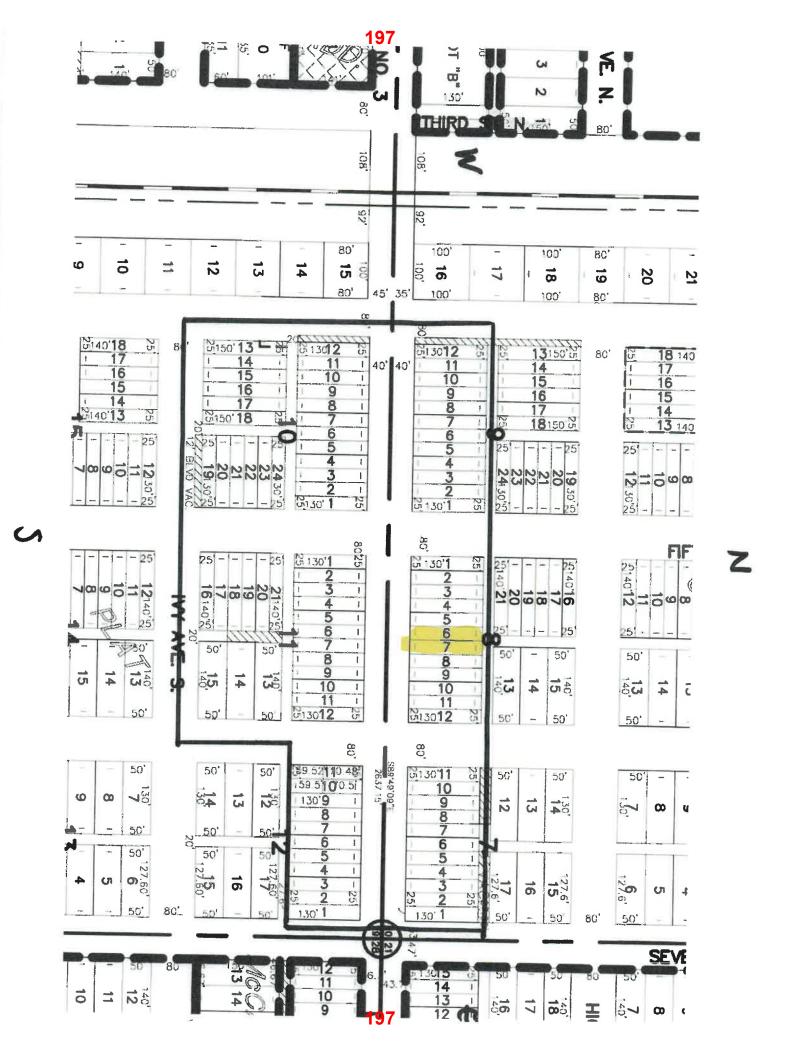
Finally, we received word from both the Oakes Policy Department and the Oakes Fire District that they are willing to fully donate all their time to ensure the labor is completed.

All of these entities came together to create a vision for our community where people will be able to enjoy one another now and create memories for generations to come.



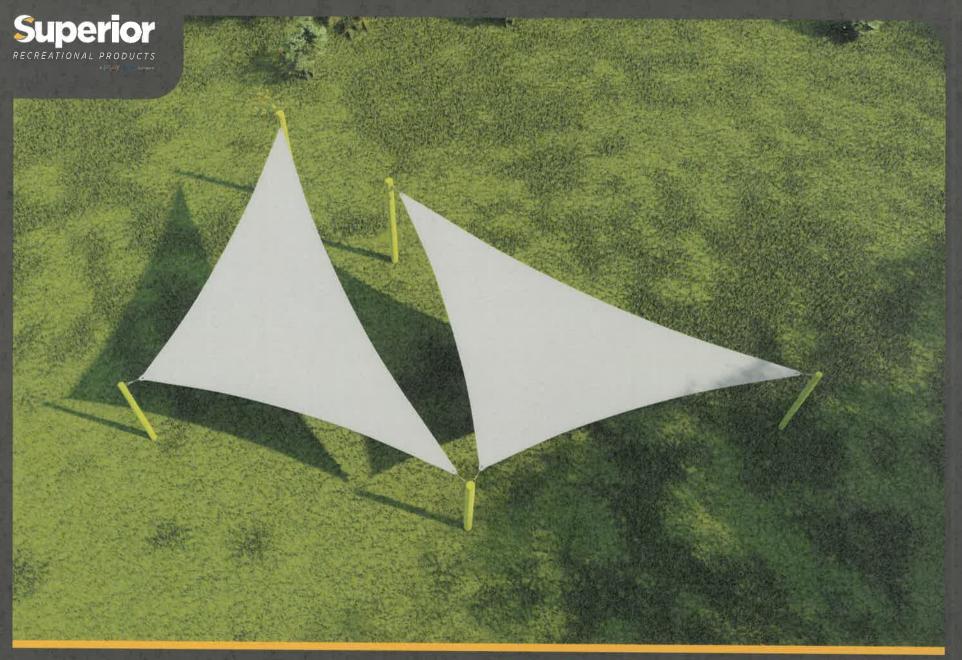

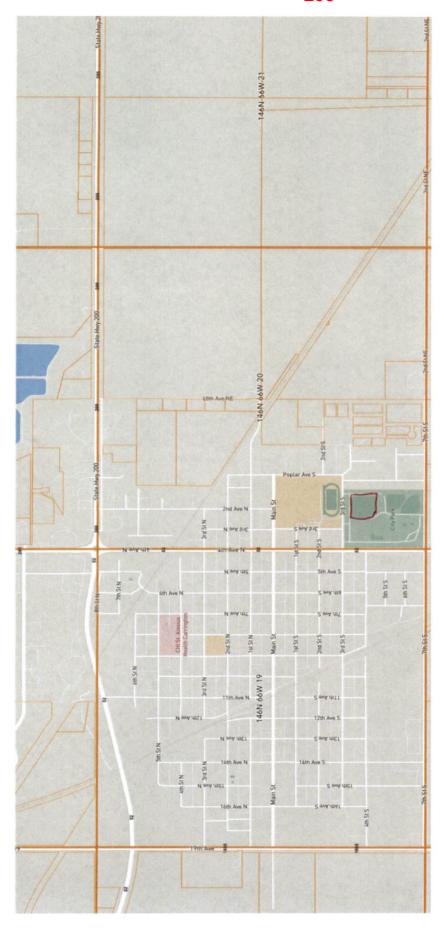

OUR REQUEST

The Grand Forks Park District plans to replace the Infield Turf at the Kraft baseball field in Grand Forks. The Kraft Field Turf project is the second phase of a substantial refurbishing of the baseball field complex in entirety, which has been in the planning for several years and started underway this spring.

Through the summer of 2023, the Kraft Field grandstand structure has been going through a replacement process. The grandstand replacement was the first phase of the overall Kraft Field restructuring project and in 2022, the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District awarded the Grand Forks Park District a grant for the Kraft Field Grandstand replacement. We anticipate the grandstand to be completed by spring of 2024 and the Infield Turf phase to commence thereafter. We respectfully request a grant for the Infield resurfacing of this state-of-the-art baseball infield at the Kraft Field complex.

A conceptual drawing and a pricing proposal for the Infield Turf has been attached to this grant application.



NEED FOR THE INFIELD TURF AND PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

The existing artificial infield surface at Kraft Field was installed in 2011 and became one of the first artificial baseball playing surfaces in the state. However, over time with wear and tear, the lifecycle of this surface has come to its end and replacement is badly needed. With the long North Dakota winters, an early start to the baseball season can make a significant difference to the players and organizations who use Kraft Field for play, practice and competition. The artificial turf allows spring drying to occur more quickly as well as games to be played on a wider range of weather conditions.

The project has been a priority for the Grand Forks Park District as it analyzes its facilities throughout the city to match community needs within current budgetary constraints. The Grand Forks Park District has been in cooperation with the Grand Forks Area Youth Baseball Association since the fall of 2019 in developing a proactive concept to the overall plans for Kraft Field.

Currently the user base includes, among others, the Grand Forks Area Youth Baseball Association, the University of North Dakota Baseball Club, American Legion baseball, as well as the Grand Forks Public School District. Additionally, Kraft Field will be host to the 2025 North Dakota High School Baseball Tournament.

ESTIMATED BUDGET

The Grand Forks Park District has allocated funds to the project from its capital and betterment budget, which combined with this grant would fully fund this phase of the project. Attached to this grant application is the "FieldTurf" pricing proposal.

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Minot Pump Track Project - Supplemental Grant Information Garrison Diversion Grant Request

Description of Project Features:

The Minot Park District is partnering with the Give360 Giving Circle (Minot Area Community Foundation) in developing Minot Park District property located west of the Jack Hoeven Park Baseball fields to construct a pump track.

The pump track would be a component of an overall master plan for this location, to include proposed plans for an inclusive playground with poured-in-place protective surfacing, vehicle parking, restroom building, and paved walking paths with connections to existing paths.

The goal is to construct two pump tracks that cater to a diverse range of needs. The first track will be designed for all ages and abilities, ensuring an inclusive experience for everyone. The second track will feature a fully handicap accessible loop as well as a dedicated "safety town" section tailored for our youngest riders. This track will offer additional programming opportunities for public safety education and adaptive sports group use.

Besides being an innovative play park amenity trending in more and more public spaces, a pump track is a track for wheeled sports equipment that, when ridden properly, does not require pedaling or pushing, but a "pumping" action to maintain momentum. A pump track is a loop that consists of a series of rollers (bumps or small hills in the track) and berms (corners). The "pump" part is the pushing-down and pulling-up action performed by riders in accordance with the structures design as the main source of propulsion. Pump tracks are designed this way so they can be ridden completely without the need for pushing and pedaling, making it relatively simple to use and caters to a wide variety of rider skill levels and accessible to wheelchairs.

Who does the program serve:

The Minot Pump Track will be owned and maintained by the Minot Park District, and accessible to all ages and abilities. The pump track will benefit not only the residents of Minot (50,000+) but also those from surrounding areas and visitors to come to our region in the summer months. With the nearest pump track located in Dunn Center, ND, the establishment of a pump track in Minot holds potential to serve a wider audience. The addition of connecting walking paths will integrate this project with existing amenities in the area, such as the Hoeven Ball Park and Wee Links Golf Course, transforming it into a destination for individuals of all ages and interests throughout the community. Furthermore, this initiative will seamlessly connect with the pre-existing citywide fitness paths, thereby ensuring enhanced accessibility for the entire Minot area.

The pump track provides an inclusive space where children of all ages and abilities can engage in physical activity, learn new skills, and foster social connections. By investing in this

project, all children have the opportunity to participate, promoting physical fitness and healthy lifestyles while nurturing their overall development.

Project Budget: \$300,000

\$300,000 is the amount that was quoted by EAPC for the completion of the pump track. This will include the groundwork and installation as well as additional site drainage required to keep water out of the recessed areas between the tracks.

The Minot Park District has engaged EAPC for the professional services of the location design. EAPC has engaged KLJ as civil engineering consultant, and EAPC will work directly with Pump Trax USA for the Pump Track course design.

Additional Funding Sources:

The Give360 Giving Circle has partnered with Minot Parks to fully fundraise the amount needed for the two pump tracks. Give360 was founded in 2011 as a community giving circle under the Minot Area Community Foundation. Its diverse membership embodies a collective commitment to addressing and surpassing the evolving needs of our community. Through annual financial contributions, members pool their resources to create a fund that is leveraged for significant community projects. Since inception, Give360 has invested over \$160,000 into the community.

Upon the announcement of fundraising for the pump track, Give360 committed \$30,000 towards it, with the intent to allocate more through annual membership donations.

Additionally, \$100,000 in matching funds from the Minot Junior Golf Association, which will match dollar for dollar funds raised up to \$100,000.

Describe Project Site as is and Additional Changes

The project site will need to be surveyed and fill will be brought in to level out the area. There will be a drainage system put in place to keep the pump track clear of low-lying drainage areas that would require additional maintenance to the pump track. The project site is in a visible location just off the bypass and located next to the Jack Hoeven Baseball Complex and Dakota Bark Park. This area sees a large number of visitors whether they are participating or attending a baseball game, enjoying an afternoon in the park with their four-legged friends or a walk on the Souris Valley Golf Course walking trail. It is also close to the Jack Hoeven Wee Links Golf Course.

This is a for budgeting and fundraising purposes and pricing may change at contract signing time.

Price shown will show deductions with help in some areas by the city of Park River. Example: Cut and remove concrete to new equipment room area. Bring in fill for pool and bring to proper height to start pad installation.

We can do all the following things, but this can cut down on the cost of the pad considerably.

Features and Parts for Pad:

3 Dumping buckets, 60" Water Mushroom, Jelly Stick, (3) Commercial 7.5" Adjustable Nozzle, (3) Commercial 7.5" Geyser Jets, Curved Activator, Sof-touch electronic timer box, 8 zone multi-program controller, project specific splash pad manifold, 2500 gallon holding tank with auto fill, 3 inch bulk head fittings, 2 inch bulk head fittings, Jandy check valve, 3-way 2 ½" diverter valve, 16" x 16" Box drain, 16" X 16" Box drain strainer basket, 3HP VSF pump for heat and chemical control, 3 to 5HP VS feature pump, Heat pump, HCC2000 chemical controller, 420 SqFt cartridge filter.

Permits would need to be obtained by the city for local and state. If inspecting firm requires blueprints that would be something that would need to be added on to price. We have been able to provide in house drawings at previous locations. ND law is different than other states that are the governing factor and some cities we deal with aren't even subject to any inspections of any kind.

We will build the splash pad with all VGB requirements, and we use the strictest guidelines for turnover rates to ensure safety for all involved.

AS of today 1/27/2022, the estimated amount for this pad.

Pad would be a light broom finish and if you wanted to upgrade to Rubber Rock it would be an upcharge of approximately \$10,800 but pricing would need to be verified.

Thank you for having me out yesterday and meeting with you and these are my findings.

1. Leak detection needed to find problem so skimmers are back up and running. 80 to 90% of pool flow needs to go through skimmers since this is where most of the bacteria is in a pool the top 18 inches.

This would need to be scheduled with our service team and for the day setting up sonar and checking the lines it can run up to \$4000.00. You can call 701-476-1732 and ask for Jake and he will get you setup

2. Small pool needs to have its own operation system with flow and chemicals, you are putting kids at risk as this pool should be turning over every 60 minutes and the large pool turnover rate is every 360 minutes.

I recommend the removal of the small pool and when funds are available replace with a splash pad there is enough room in the area for a 25 X 25 pad or 30 X 30 with a little expansion the price difference would be minor with a larger size.

3. PVC liner for large pool. This would make the pool interior maintenance free and we can add swim lane markings and that would be at no extra charge.

If this is something you would like to do it requires the following for payment. 10% down to get on the list 40% due to ship materials and 50% due upon completion. Rough estimate but need to put in contract form if interested and figure exact measurement but it would be approximately \$60,000

4. This is a highly inefficient pool with many plumbing flaws. The pool is being heated from resistant type electric heaters that are only 60% efficient.

The entire equipment room needs to be replumbed with correct size plumbing to meet VGB stands and velocity drop. The pump needs to be replaced with a high efficiency pump and an aqua drive system to save energy. A 20% reduction in pump speed is a 50% savings on electricity used and savings is \$1000 per year per HP. If pump curves show we can still use the 7.5 HP that is currently in pump room that would be a savings of \$7500 per year. Install high flow multiport valves for proper backwash, rinsing, and winterizing of sand filters.

Remove existing heaters 60% efficient and replace with heat pumps that are 450% efficient.

Water slide needs to have chemically treated water hooked up to it and remove city water for operation.

Replace diving board

Flow meters need to be operational and the current location is next to a 90-degree elbow and it can't be plumbed that way this would be done with new piping layout.

Eliminate (8) equalizer lines under skimmers and add auto fill system for pool. If you keep equalizer lines you need (8) VGB compliant covers.

These are my findings from our meeting on July 28th, 2021 please let me know how we can help.

Location: Fessenden City Park

1.Total Project Cost

We are estimating the cost to be \$197,000. We are asking for a grant of \$75,000.00. Fundraising will make up a great portion of the funding, but as of now we have raised approximately \$60,000 to be allocated for the Splash Pad project.

2. Project Description

The pool in Fessenden was built in the early 1960's and although the wading pool was added later, we do not have that exact date. Originally, the wading pool was on the same chemical/equipment system as the main pool. Because of the distance from the equipment room and the amount of water treated, the wading pool no longer met the requirements to stay on that system.

The project will consist of adding a brand-new splash pad which requires all new plumbing, skimmers, filters and equipment as well as an underground tank. The tank is required to properly circulate and treat the water.

We will replace the existing fencing and add an additional shed to house the splash pad equipment, the pool cover during the summer and storage for park equipment in the winter. The plumbing updates will create substantial savings in water usage and electricity as well as creating the flow needed to keep the water within the guidelines.

3. Project Planning

The pool has always been a major part of the park district's summer program. As the leaks became a serious issue last year, it was decided it was time to make a plan to repair the pool.

We began by hiring a company to come out and inspect the pool and make recommendations on the options available. Since the pool is a big part of the summer activities in our community, we felt the need to put the repairs at the top of the list for the coming years project list. Since the wading pool was condemned, a splash pad is the perfect addition to our park.

As community pools are vital to small towns as a source of outdoor recreation, it does meet SCORP requirements.

4. Public Involvement

We find that our community is very supportive in our goal to add a splash pad. We have had citizens approaching the board with questions about how they can donate, and citizens also offering to spearhead fundraising events to help cover the costs.

5. Operation and Maintenance

The day-to-day operation and maintenance will be handled by the Park Board and the employees hired and trained for that job. The winterizing of the pool/splash pad will be handled by a service that has the qualifications as winter seems to cause a lot of the damage.

Our pool serves as the first place a lot of local kids learn to swim; one thing our pool is known for is having the wading pool for younger siblings to enjoy while the bigger ones learn to swim. It also serves our families as a place to gather. It serves not only Fessenden, but other small towns that come for lessons and open swimming. Visitors to town also enjoy the park and pool and the campers at the campground within the park also have access to it.
